"The artist is the creator of beautiful things": Aesthetic Revolutions in fin-de-siècle England

In September 2022 the "Michel de Montaigne" Cultural Foundation will organise its 16th international conference in association with the town of Bagni di Lucca, the Istituto Storico Lucchese, and the University of Pisa. Supported and coordinated by a scientific committee of academics, the conference will be held under the aegis of the Italian Oscar Wilde Society.

The year 2022 coincides with an important event in the British cultural context, since it marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Aubrey Beardsley (1872-1898), whose illustrations and drawings for *The Yellow Book*, *The Savoy* and Wilde's *Salomé* bear memorable witness to his outstanding artistic production. Along these lines, our conference aims to explore the richness and multifaceted phenomenology of the fin de siècle in England as well as across Europe. Long investigated through the critical lens of its iconoclastic attitudes and deviance from the prescriptive codes of the Victorian age, this period is now the object of wide-ranging and philologically accurate studies that have outlined a definitely more complex scenario than, say, the one pivoting on the Naughty Nineties or Max Nordau's notion of 'degeneration'. Taking a cue from Arthur Symons's well-known statements in *The Symbolist Movement in Literature*, "the

interlude, half a mock-interlude, of Decadence, diverted the attention of the critics while something more serious was in preparation". And that 'something' is said to have temporarily crystallised "under the form of Symbolism, in which art returns to the one pathway, leading through beautiful things to the eternal beauty".

As suggested by the conference's title, taken from the opening aphorism of the Preface to *The Picture of Dorian Gray* – "The artist is the creator of beautiful things" – our aim is to provide a larger spectrum and give due credit to the relevance and achievements of latenineteenth-century artists and writers, from the deeper meanings of the 'art for art's sake' concept to the notion of the 'beautiful untrue thing', from experimental trends to the establishment of an intense transnational dialogue. As testified to by authors and personalities such as Walter Pater, Oscar Wilde and Algernon Charles Swinburne, George Moore and Ernest Dowson, Edward Burne-Jones and Aubrey Beardsley, Vernon Lee, Michael Field and George Egerton, the fin de siècle does not seem to merely celebrate the end of an era. Indeed, it can be seen as poignantly interpreting the transition to a new beginning.

This conference invites papers that explore fields, phenomenologies and topics which include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Forms of poetic expression in the British fin de siècle: experimental contaminations between different arts and languages; the 'condition of music' as a source and cornerstone for artistic inspiration; European and international horizons; historical approaches and (trans)historical intersections (e.g. with the Renaissance, ancient myths, the decline of great empires); Pre-Raphaelitism, Impressionism, Japonisme, Art Nouveau, new figural concepts; ekphrasis and alchemies of perception; antimimeticism, antimaterialism, symbolism, mysticism, magic and occultism; eros and seduction; the aesthetics of refinement, the exotic and the grotesque
- Socio-cultural phenomenologies: the 'Romantic Agony', i.e. the episteme of Decadence; prophets and apostles of the 'religion of art'; the voyeur, flâneur, dandy, homme fatal, and femme fatale; the political as well as seductive power of words; the aesthetic-decadent fashion and its echoes in magazines of humour and satire; the philosophy of otium and anti-philistinism; from the succès de scandale of literary and art works to scandals in the socio-political contexts; solipsism, obsession, disease and 'perversion'
- Symbols and icons; mirrors and artifice; textiles, clothing and costumes; masks, dressing up, cross-dressing; the body and the performing arts (dancing, theatre choreography, the opera, filmography)
- Voices, protagonists, experimenters: commentaries on authors, cultural mediators, theatre managers, gallerists and art dealers, editorial initiatives and projects
- The idea of 'aesthetic uselessness' and the cult of beauty: artifacts and precious materials, the perfect care for details, the search for revealing correspondences, 'ornamental grammar' and aesthetic architectures
- Fin de siècle, fin du globe: the end of the nineteenth century then and now; relationships between Decadence and Modernism, Queer Studies, Gender Studies, pop culture, transgenderism; late-nineteenth-century cosmopolitanism and today's globalisation.
